However, in light of the current situation with social distancing, we are making it available on-line exclusively for one day only. This is a great way to mark Manitoba Day on May 12 as we lead into the 150th anniversary celebration. We also hope that by viewing the film, people will be inspired by the history and motivated to visit the many attractions and businesses in the area once social distancing is over. All these attractions and businesses need our support, now more than ever.

To further encourage visitation, we have an added incentive. After viewing the documentary, we encourage people to answer a short quiz on our Facebook page, which will make them eligible for major prizes including gift certificates at various businesses and admissions to area attractions.
